Professor Nicholas Glozier, MA MSc MBBS MRCPsych FRANZCP PhD Professor of Psychological Medicine, Central Clinical School & Brain & Mind Centre, University of Sydney School of Medicine, SYDNEY

Professor Nicholas Glozier is a consultant psychiatrist specialising in epidemiology, clinical trials and health services research. He has research interests in mental health and sleep, particularly wellbeing, the workplace, stress, disability and discrimination in our changing psychosocial and technological environments. Clinically he is consultant in the Local Health District Community Team and runs a clinical trials unit focussing on chronic mood and sleep conditions.

In eleven years since arriving in Australia he has been awarded over \$24 million in nationally competitive grants as a Chief Investigator, including two current NHMRC Centres for Research Excellences and a \$3 million program on wellbeing@work funded by beyondblue and Movember.



In the late nineties Prof Glozier worked at the World Health Organisation (WHO) and is an author of the WHO's Disability Classification System, the ICF, and was part of the development team for the WHO Disablement Assessment Schedule (WHODAS –II). He has a number of projects in developing settings.

He has strong links with industry and Government undertaking policy relevant and end user driven research. He is a consultant to Government organisations, mental health commissions, and NGOs such as RUOK?.

He is a member of Healthy Sydney University and the multi-disciplinary Public Mental Health and Wellbeing Research Network.
